- During cold winter months, please remember to promptly bring in your full water bottles indoors to prevent from freezing.
- Always protect empty 3 and 5 gallon bottles from becoming contaminated in storage before their return.
- Never use our bottles to store or carry gasoline or any other substance that may compromise their quality.

In the event of contamination to one of our bottles, please contact us immediately to retrieve it so we can properly dispose of it.

Through its *Ready Campaign*, the Federal Emergency Management Agency educates and empowers Americans to take some simple steps to prepare for and respond to potential emergencies, including natural disasters and terrorist attacks. *Ready* asks individuals to do three key things: get an emergency supply kit, make a family emergency plan, and be informed about the different types of emergencies that could occur and their appropriate responses.

All Americans should have some basic supplies on hand in order to survive for at least three days if an emergency occurs. Following is a listing of some basic items that every emergency supply kit should include. However, it is important that individuals review this list and consider where they live and the unique needs of their family in order to create an emergency supply kit that will meet these needs. Individuals should also consider having at least two emergency supply kits, one full kit at home and smaller portable kits in their workplace, vehicle or other places they spend time.
